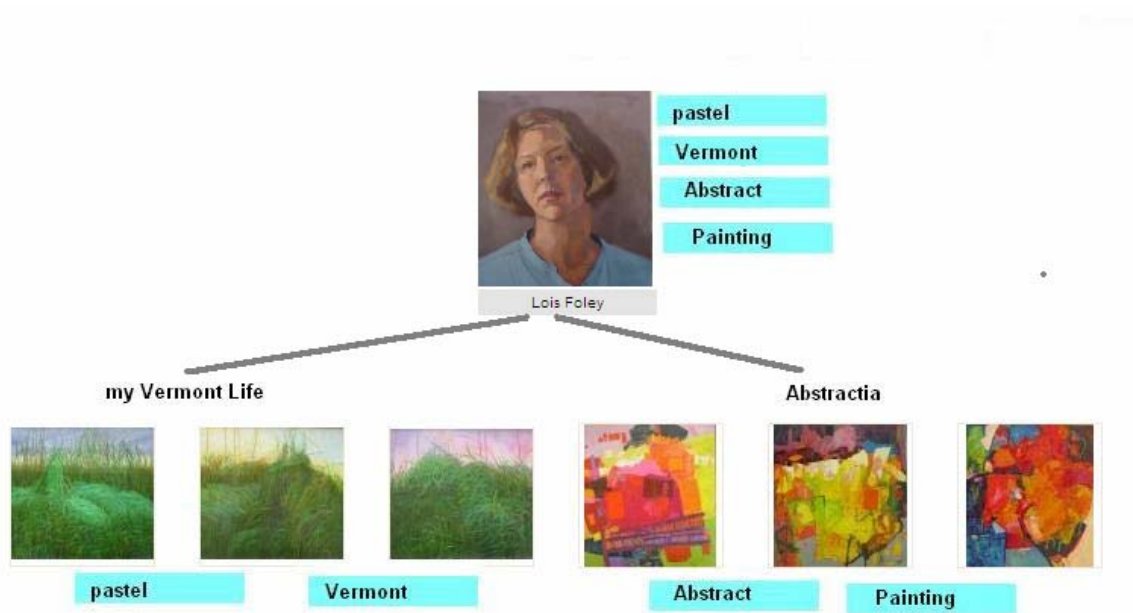


Assigning Tags in myartspace

Tags are assigned to images to make them easier to locate for other people. Tags are also passed “up the hierarchy” so that galleries and artists can be located by tags used to best describe an image.

Below is a visual representation that helps understand how tags work. What you see at the bottom of the picture are 6 images. The 3 images on the left are tagged “pastel” and “Vermont”. The 3 images on the right are tagged “abstract” and “painting”. There are two galleries – “my Vermont Life” and “Abstractia”. If you were search for a gallery that was “abstract”, then you would locate the later in a search. Not, since the artist has both galleries, then all the tags assigned to those galleries get assigned to the artist as well.



The new Tag Selection Window in the GalleryWizard

Beginning on Friday, June 15th, the GalleryWizard will allow people to have more flexibility to select and assign tags to their images they are uploading. The first version will NOT be available to Macintosh users due to some challenges with the Safari browser, but should work fine for most Windows user.


The GalleryWizard is the fast, simple way in which a myartspace user can upload images and create a presentation gallery. When a user logs in, their welcome page has a selection “Create A New Gallery”. By clicking on this choice you start up the GalleryWizard.

When you are uploading images, a “Tags” button appears on the page. By clicking on it, a “tag cloud” appears like the image below. The first “tag cloud” shows the most popular 50 tags used by people in the community. You can click on a tag word to select one. You can bring up the dialog box multiple times to assign multiple tags. If you click on the “All Tags” button, you will see a much larger selection of tags that are used by the whole community. And finally, you can simply type in a tag on the upper right side of the tag cloud where it says “Add my own tag” to create a new tag.

CREATE GALLERY: IMAGE UPLOAD # 1

Click on the "Browse..." button below to select a graphic image to upload to your gallery. Add the name, medium and dimensions to the image if possible. And finally, you can assign "tags" to your image so it is easier to locate by others.

Adding or Revising Tags to Existing Images

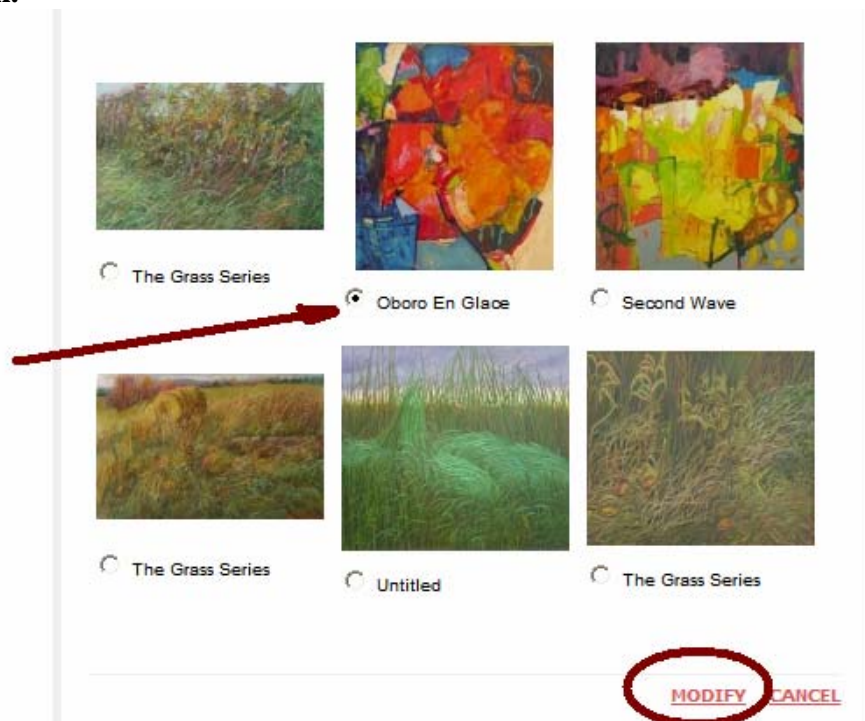
In order to add or remove tags from an image, you must edit that image. The following are the steps you should take.

From the Login/Welcome Screen, click on “Advanced image editing”.

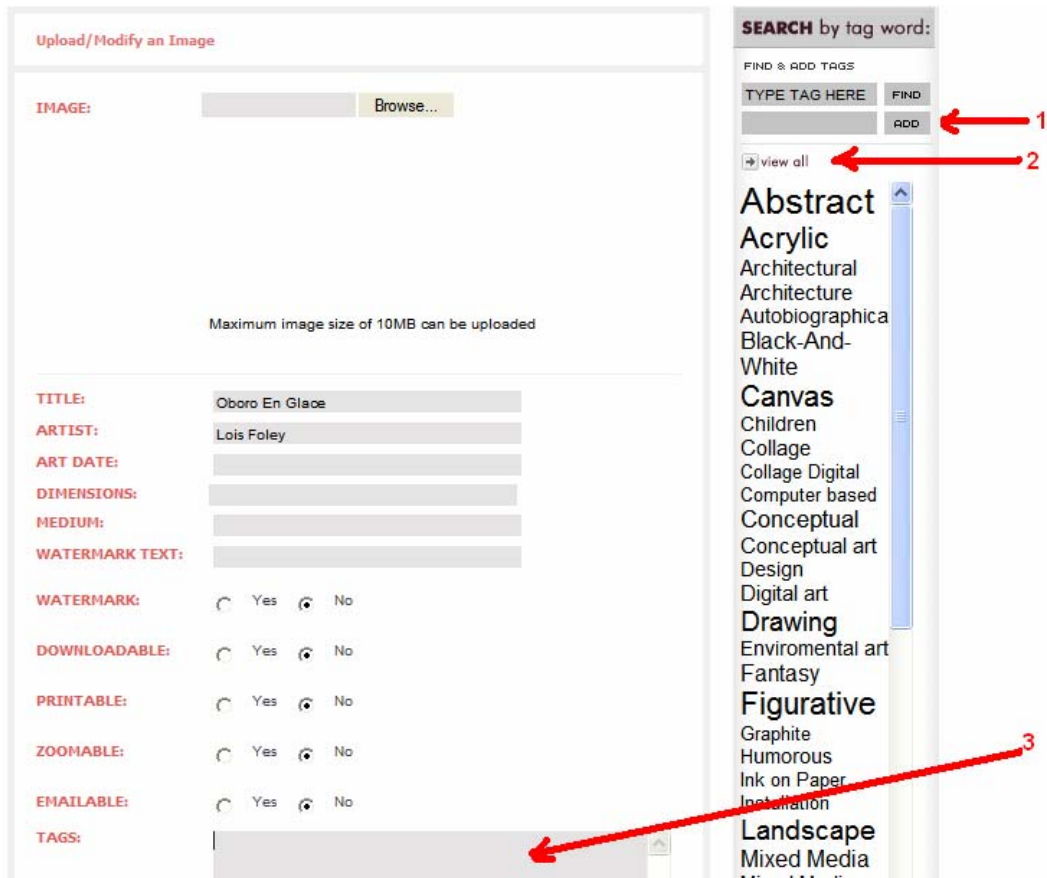
- Edit Profile
- Create a new gallery
- Edit Gallery
- Attach video to a gallery
- Attach music to a gallery
- Advanced image editing 
- Advanced portfolio editing
- Message Box (0 unread)
- Network/Friend Requests (2)
- Manage Network
- Tell people about your galleries

Or, optionally, select “my images” from the “my work space” pull-down menu.

Next, you will see all of your images you have uploaded in the “image library”. Select the image you wish to modify and click on the “modify” button at the bottom of the form.



You will now see a form with the title of the image, the artist name, date, dimensions, and other attributes that have been set. You will NOT see the image itself, but don't be bothered by that at the moment.



In the image above, you can see the “tag cloud” to the right of the image edit form. If you click on one of the tag names in the cloud, it will appear in the tag list assigned to the image (item 3 above). If you click on item 2 in the diagram above “view all”, the program will switch from showing you the top-50 most popular tags to a list of all tags. And finally, if you wish to simply add a tag by typing it, you can fill in the form field to the left of item 1 on the diagram above and click “Add”.

When you are done, be sure to click on the “Save” button to store your changes.
